Questions about what **should** –or **should not**—go in the green bins occasionally arise in conversation as we all attempt to comply with the new regulations. We discovered that there is a complete list on the City of Ottawa Green Bin site on line. We also discovered that items that can be included vary city by city. So, one cannot assume that Ottawa is the same as Perth or Toronto for example. This is likely due to the capacity of the recycling installations in different municipalities.

For your convenience, here are the $\ensuremath{\text{Yes}}$ lists and the $\ensuremath{\text{No}}$ lists.

Yes: Meat, fish, bones, eggshells including butchers' meat wrap, dryer lint, vacuum contents and bags, food soiled pizza boxes and other items such as wooden popsicle sticks, toothpicks, sugar, flour, microwave popcorn and paper bags, pet feces only when in sealed plastic bags, soiled tissues, napkins, paper towels etc. , when placed n plastic bags from grocery, and paper coffee cups and waxed paper cups, household plants including soil (no pots).

NO: Glass, diapers, sanitary products, cutlery, Tetra Pak cartons, black plastic food trays.
